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#### Director's Note

**The Clean House** premiered just over 20 years ago now, when playwright Sarah Ruhl was 30 years old. This play, and her **Eurydice** the year before, launched her into the public spotlight. Just 2 years later, she received a MacArthur Foundation Fellowship. 2 of her plays, including **The Clean House**, have been finalists for the Pulitzer prize, and casts and audiences from then until now have been entertained, moved, and sometimes puzzled, by her unique voice.

Still, this play and its playwright will be new to many that sit with us in the theater during this run, and we love that we can share it with you. It's been a gift for us -- exploring a newer play, by an unique artist, is one of the great joys in the theatre: it's exciting to develop a vision of the play in rehearsal without years and years of scholarship and expectations about the play informing the creative choices.

Beyond that, this play, with its quirky but loving outlook, is one that gets underneath your skin -- we fell in love with it, and then fell in love some more. Sarah Ruhl is a keen observer of human nature, its heroism and its failings, and she doesn't judge her characters; she simply gives them a chance to be heard.

These five individuals, like all the rest of us, are just struggling to find their place -- and their people, their family.

Who are they "meant" to be with?

They want to connect.

And, they want to make peace, to discover and follow their bliss, to live or die on their own terms.

Of all the journeys we may go on in our lives, there are none more important than these.

There are many people I know, young and old, who I see have found their Soulmates; I think they know who they are, and they have my deep thanks for their inspiration.
